Dear Parents and Carers,

To-day marks the end of the first half of the summer term. A very short half term with some interruptions due to bank holiday breaks, but nevertheless busy. Pupils have had the opportunity to start the practice Bronze and Silver Expeditions, Key Stage 5 visited The Conway outdoor centre, trips to explore local history and the Great Fire of Nantwich- 1583, a residential inspection celebration for pupils who attend residential. School also planned this week for the upcoming Sports Day Monday 16<sup>th</sup> June. Key Stage 4 and 5 pupils have started the examination part of their accredited courses- good luck to them.

We also welcomed new Teaching Assistant staff as school invests further in the teaching team. School has also successfully appointed a new Deputy Headteacher- Welcome Mr Power, who will be responsible for a wide range of strategic school developments, including the curriculum. A very experienced senior leader, I am already fortunate enough to have been working with Mr Power to build on the success of schools last inspection.

I have a responsibility to make sure all pupils, staff and visitors are safe when they visit us. School has in place a wide range of health and safety measures to secure the safety of all. A recent Health and Safety Audit highlighted how highly regarded our systems are by Cheshire West and Chester. Congratulations to Dottie, Vicki, P&M Maintenance and John, for their work in gaining this judgement. An example of one of our systems is the termly 'lockdown drill' which was successfully carried out on 14<sup>th</sup> May. All pupils and staff were able to access a safe space in school in the event of a lockdown. This could result in the event of a local chemical spill or the need for an Air Ambulance to access our school field in an emergency. Pupils coped really well with the drill.
