A message from Public Health

Dear Parents and Carers,

Measles is on the increase in Cheshire & Merseyside – make sure your child has received two doses of the Measles, Mumps, & Rubella (MMR) vaccine for full protection.

Measles is an infection that spreads very easily. It can cause serious illness in some people and in rare cases, spread to the lungs or the brain. Babies and pregnant women are at increased risk of harm. Having two doses of the MMR vaccine is the best way to prevent measles.

Measles usually starts with a runny nose, sneezing, coughing, and a high temperature. It may cause red, sore eyes. The measles rash will appear a few days later, starting on the face and behind the ears before spreading to the rest of the body. There may be small white spots inside the cheeks.

If you suspect you or your child has measles, phone your GP or NHS 111 for advice. Do not go directly to the GP surgery as measles is highly infectious. Do not send children to school or childcare if you think they have measles. People of any age can become infected with measles if they have not been fully vaccinated. Two doses of the MMR vaccine provides lifelong protection against measles, mumps, and rubella. The MMR vaccine is safe and effective. The first dose is given at the age of 12 months and the 2nd dose is given at 3 years and 4 months old for those born before 1 July 2024, or at 18 months for those born on or after 1 July 2024.

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Ask at your GP surgery if you're not sure whether you or your child has been fully vaccinated. You can also check your child's Red Book. Your GP surgery can administer the MMR vaccine to you and your child for free on the NHS. It is never too late to catch up. You can be vaccinated at ANY age. If you have any questions about the MMR vaccine, a nurse will be happy to answer them at your appointment. School closes for the Sumer break on **Tuesday 22nd July** and will re-open for pupils **Wednesday 3rd September.** When we reopen, we will welcome a new Deputy Headteacher- Mr McCormick, who will join the Senior Management Team with Mr Power, Key Stage Managers, our Operations Manager and School Business Manager. Exciting times ahead.

School continues to experience pressure on places at school. In recent years we have moved from 106 to 133. To help ease the congestion and pressure on resources we have engaged with Cheshire West and Chester to repurpose existing bungalow accommodation at the front of school. The aim is to create 4 teaching rooms, a kitchen area and therapy rooms for our 6th Form provision. The work is due to start in September and be finished in May 2026 (assuming there are no surprises). At the end of the project, we will have a quality fully refurbished post 16 provision.

I would like to finish my final letter of the academic year by thanking all pupils, parents, carers and staff for their support, contributions and encouragement. It has been a challenging few years but we are in a really good place, with the ambition of moving from good to great. Have a great Summer break.
